

Universities, GINs and Interactions

Literature on firms interacting with universities: tends to investigate interactions within national boundaries of a single country

Klevorick et al (1995) and Cohen et al (2002)

Literature on GINs: universities are typically seen as important (pool of S&T talent) for the emergence of GINs, but research has given very limited attention to their role

- =>Literature + empirical research = a tentative framework and taxonomy








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Picture becomes more complex....








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Global Interactions Between Firms and Universities





Tentative Typology: Firms and Universities

- 1. Only LOCAL (home country) interactions
- 2. INTERNATIONAL interactions of LOCAL firms
- 3. TNCs interacting only with their LOCAL universities
- 4. TNCs interacting both with LOCAL and FOREIGN (host country) universities
- 5. Firms that interact with NETWORKS of universities
- 6. A NON-HIERARCHICAL NETWORK between MNC headquarters and subsidiaries and universities
- 7. INTERNATIONAL CONSORTIA between firms and universities
